Record crowd expected for 30th anniversary of Greater Chicago Food Depository's Hunger Walk

Event benefits Cook County food pantries, soup kitchens and shelters

On Saturday, June 20, thousands will gather at Soldier Field for the Greater Chicago Food Depository's 30th Annual Hunger Walk. The event, a family-friendly 5K walk along the lakefront and Chicago's largest anti-hunger rally, raises awareness of hunger in our community and benefits food pantries, soup kitchens and shelters in Cook County.

"The Hunger Walk started as a gathering of a few hundred people in 1986 and has grown tremendously in thirty years," said Kate Maehr, Food Depository executive director and CEO. "It's more than a fundraiser – it's a symbol of our entire community's belief that no one should go hungry."

The 30th Annual Hunger Walk is a fun opportunity for families, businesses, individuals and organizations to join the fight against hunger. As many as 15,000 men, women and children are expected to attend this year's event, which will include activities and entertainment throughout the morning.



Mayor Emanuel Announces Divvy Expanding To New Neighborhoods

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced today that Divvy has started its first major expansion into more Chicago neighborhoods. By June, Chicago's bike share system will reach as far north as Touhy Avenue, as far south as 75th Street and as far west as Pulaski Road. After the expansion, Divvy will offer a total of 476 stations and 4,760 bikes across 86.7 square miles, giving Chicago the most bike share stations and largest service area in North America.

"Bike sharing like Divvy works best when more neighborhoods are served, and in the next few months Chicago will have the largest service area in North America," said Mayor Emanuel. "We are encouraged by Divvy's popularity, and this expansion will ensure more residents in more neighborhoods can access this system."

Divvy's expansion, from the previous number of 300 stations and 3,000 bikes, roughly doubles its service area in Chicago, from 44.1 square miles to 86.7 square miles, reaching 33 out of the city's 50 Aldermanic wards, up from 19 before the expansion.

Divvy, which features bikes in the signature blue of its system sponsor Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois (BCBSIL), started adding new stations further south last week. Once stations in those neighborhoods are installed, the expansion will proceed to neighborhoods on the west side, and then finally neighborhoods on the north side. Stations will also be added to the existing service areas to provide improved accessibility for Divvy's existing and new customers.

"This is a major step forward for Divvy, the City's newest transit service, as we continue to increase access in neighborhoods across Chicago," CDOT Commissioner Rebekah Scheinfeld said. "CDOT is committed to building on the great momentum that we achieved in Divvy's first two years and we hope to continue extending Divvy's reach to even more neighborhoods.'

The planning process for the expansion involved significant community engagement, including the review of hundreds of suggestions from Chicagoans on where the new stations should be located.

"Slow Roll Chicago supports the expansion of Divvy in Chicago on the South Side and West Side," said Slow Roll Co-founder Oboi Reed. "We are especially happy to see Divvy expand to more communities of color and low- to moderateincome neighborhoods. We believe intensely in the transformative power of bicycles as a form of transportation. And, we consider Divvy a public resource that all Chicagoans should have equitable access to. We appreciate Divvy's progress in this area and we look forward to helping grow the system even more in underserved communities across the City of Chicago."

'We are thrilled at the expansion of Divvy into the West Humboldt Park neighborhood," said Tom Otto, Program Manager for the West Humboldt Park Development Council. "It greatly helps the community to become both more healthy and more mobile by providing access to recreational, educational and cultural assets. Divvy expansion will also support the

West Chicago Avenue Rebuild Project to revitalize the Chicago Avenue commercial corridor."



Village Cooking Corner

BEAN SALAD

This recipe comes from my good friend Eleanor. She made a "Three Bean Salad" on the occasion of her parents' wedding anniversary, and I have made it many, many times since that happy occasion, but I have added a fourth bean, namely chick (garbanzo) beans, because I have a special liking for them, and because BEANS ARE GOOD FOR THE BODY! It's a great make-ahead side dish for picnics or any family gathering, and it keeps well in the refrigerator for up to a week. If you brown-bag your lunches, why not fill up a container and take it along for lunch and enjoy it with your sandwich?

One can each French style (or regular) green beans, yellow wax beans, dark red kidney beans and chick beans plus ½ cup each of chopped onions and chopped green pepper. Drain the canned beans (you might want to rinse the red ones) and put them into a large heat-proof dish. Add the onions and green pepper.

Cooked Dressing:

Place in saucepan and bring to a boil: \(\frac{1}{2} \) cup Wesson oil, \(\frac{1}{2} \) cup vinegar, 1 cup water, 2 tablespoons of sugar and 1 teaspoon salt. Turn heat down and let it simmer for a couple of minutes, then allow to cool and pour over the beans. Place the cover on the pot and instead of stirring the beans, which might break them up, slowly use a circular motion to mix all the ingredients together. Repeat the "stirring" procedure every couple of hours and place in refrigerator over night. To serve, pour the bean salad into a plastic or glass bowl about half an hour before serving, and lastly add some freshly ground black pepper on top. Serve with a slotted spoon and enjoy!

A Story of When Joint Tenancy Went Very Wrong

Helen had been blessed with great health all her life, and it never seemed important to her to do any estate planning. In her late 70's she was diagnosed with a terminal illness. She concentrated on enjoying her last months to the best of her abilities and decided to take what seemed like the easiest way to deal with her estate. She put all she had, bank accounts, certificates of deposit and her house, into joint tenancy with her oldest son, George. Helen had complete faith in George and knew that he would carry out her wishes. Her estate would be distributed to George and his 4 siblings after Helen's passing. George's youngest sister, Margaret, was a widow with three young children. He was directed to give her a larger share than the others in order to help with her children's education.

Helen felt that she had done the right thing in order to have her estate distributed according to her wishes, and she had avoided any attorney's fees while doing so. She felt at peace.

After Helen's passing, as she had hoped, her entire estate went to her trusted son, George. And George had every intention of distributing the estate according to her wishes. Did joint tenancy work for Helen in passing on her estate? You can argue that it did...it passed her estate on to her trusted son, George. But would Helen have been pleased with the outcome? By not considering that the unforeseen can sometimes turn an estate plan upside down, she had basically disinherited four of her five children.
