Cook County Assessor's Office Audit Highlights Need For Data Modernization

Report Also Recommends Investment In Staffing And Technology

The International Association of Assessing Officers (IAAO) today released a report to the Cook County Board detailing the findings of a comprehensive audit of the Cook County Assessor's Office (CCAO) operations. The report found a significant need to modernize the data used by the Assessors' Office as well as invest in staffing and technology upgrades.

The IAAO audit was conducted at the invitation of Cook County Assessor Fritz Kaegi and his staff to identify strengths and weaknesses in current operations as he reforms the office.

The IAAO is a global community of mass appraisal expects who promote excellence in appraisal, assessment administration, and property tax policy. The audit's goal was to identify opportunities to improve office operations, especially in the area of valuations and data modernization, and determine the resources needed to support Assessor Kaegi's vision of an office driven by a commitment to equity, fairness, and transparency.

"The IAAO excels at identifying best practices in assessment offices around the world," said Assessor Kaegi. "We want to adopt the highest standards in Cook County so it made sense to ask those who operate at the highest professional level in the field."

Since taking office last December, Assessor Kaegi pledged to use IAAO standards for uniformity in grading the quality of his office's assessment work. In the 2019 re-assessment of the north suburbs, the CCAO achieved IAAO standards for residential assessment in four of the five re-assessed townships.

The IAAO audit was initiated by the Civic Consulting Alliance, which was contracted in 2018 by Cook County Board President Toni Preckwinkle to perform an external analysis of the Cook County Assessor's Office, and paid for through a grant by the MacArthur Foundation.

Mayor Lightfoot Creates New Website For Residents To Receive Information and Updates On 2020 U.S. Census

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot today rolled out a new census website - census 2020.chicago.gov a one-stop shop to support the city's complete count effort for the upcoming 2020 census. The comprehensive website provides residents with updated information on how to participate in the census, city resources aiding in ensuring a full count, and what's at stake for next year's count.

"While the 2020 census kicks off next April, the City isn't wasting any time in preparing for a full count that will ensure every resident is represented, and that Chicago gets our fair share from the federal government," said Mayor Lightfoot. "The inclusion of every Chicagoan is essential to the 2020 census count, and over the next several months our team will be working hard to ensure that all residents, even in the hardest to reach places, have the information and the comfort they need to

The website provides a timeline for responding to the census and hosts a menu of resources from the U.S. Census Bureau and local community partners. To enhance participation, the website addresses concerns about access to internet, safety, privacy and confidentiality on the FAQ page. The website also features a map of Connect Chicago locations for residents who do not have computers

The new 2020 census website is fully accessible to every user, providing detailed information available in several languages including Spanish, Polish, Mandarin, Arabic and Tagalog. It also lists ways to get involved in the 2020 census including how to work for the U.S. Census Bureau.

A complete count is critical for the future of Chicago. The federal government uses census data to distribute nearly \$700 billion in funding that touches every Chicagoan through education, school lunch programs, healthcare, infrastructure and more. For each person missed during the census, the City risks losing \$1,400, as well as representation in Congress.

Mayor Lightfoot is committed to ensuring a unified citywide approach to ensuring that every Chicagoan participates in the 2020 census. Last week, Mayor Lightfoot and the City Council announced the creation of a new Special Legislative Committee on the Census.

Commissioner Miller's Consent Calendar Resolution Highlights the Importance of Immunization in Cook County

(Cook County Commissioner Donna Miller (D-6th) today announced that her resolution designating August as Immunization Awareness Month in Cook County will be addressed at tomorrow's Cook County Consent Calendar Board Meeting. Commissioner Miller said, "The resolution declaring August Immunization Awareness month in Cook County is ceremonial, but the intent is anything but, as we have seen preventable life-threating diseases rear their ugly head again throughout the country, and so continued education and making people aware of the importance of keeping up to date on their vaccines is vitally important."

"In addition to saving lives, vaccines provide major cost savings by preventing serious infectious diseases, and prevent us from spending large amounts of money on treating them" said Commissioner Miller, adding "As the operator of one of the largest Public Health Systems in the country, Cook County Government and our health system bears a large portion of the economic burden of treating preventable diseases."

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), for every \$1 spent on childhood vaccinations, our country saves \$10.10 and vaccines given to children born between 1994-2016 will prevent an estimated 381 million illnesses, 24.5 million hospitalizations, 855,000 deaths, and \$1.65 trillion in total societal costs.

"August is National Immunization Awareness Month, which is also back to school time and so it makes perfect sense to coincide this resolution with these events to help get the word out, and encourage everyone to remind their family, friends, and coworkers to stay up to date on their shots" said Miller.

Mayor Lightfoot Announces Citywide Survey To Gain Input On Future Casino

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot today announced next steps toward the City's initial efforts to plan for the first-ever casino located in Chicago. Following last week's launch of a financial feasibility study, the City is moving forward to ensure community feedback is considered before planning gets underway on a new casino. A survey launched today will allow residents to weigh in on their preferences for what they would like to see included in a Chicago casino. The survey is available now at www.chicago.gov/

"To learn more about what Chicagoans want to see in a new casino, today we are launching a survey that will give our residents a voice in informing how this development can drive the maximum benefit for all communities," said Mayor Lightfoot. "While the prospect of a new casino holds tremendous potential for generating new revenues and stimulating economic opportunity for Chicago, we are committed to a transparent process for ensuring all voices can be heard as the City moves forward on

The survey seeks information from participants about ways it can benefit the community, including: preferred amenities, where it could be most conveniently located, and how often they would visit a

A new casino is envisioned for Chicago as a result of recently enacted legislation and is made possible as a result of Mayor Lightfoot's efforts working with state leadership to secure the requisite approvals. Under the state law, new revenues from a Chicago casino will be used to fund Chicago's police and fire pensions. It is estimated that a Chicago casino will create thousands of jobs as well as contracting opportunities for the community.

Mayor Lightfoot Announces A Major Increase In Accessible Pedestrian Signals At Intersections Across Chicago

Mayor Lori E. Lightfoot announced today that Chicago will be adding up to 100 new Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS) at locations across the city in the next two years as a result of a new policy developed through a partnership between the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT) and the Mayor's Office for People with Disabilities (MOPD). APS communicates information about the WALK and DON'T WALK intervals at signalized intersections in non-visual formats (i.e., audible tones and vibrotactile surfaces) to pedestrians

"Chicago's mission is to be the most inclusive and accessible city in the nation, and that means building a transportation system that fully serves every resident," said Mayor Lightfoot. "I commend the collaborative efforts of CDOT and MOPD as they significantly increase the number of Accessible Pedestrian Signals across our city, enabling both residents and visitors with visual disabilities to live more freely and safely throughout Chicago."

Mayor Lightfoot made the announcement on the 29th anniversary of the Americans with

Approximately 50 additional installations of APS will occur via upcoming roadway, signal modernization and new traffic signal projects over the next two years.

Allemande Into Autumn at Free 'Intro to Square Dance' Parties

Glenview Square Dance Club will offer two, free "Intro to Square Dance" parties in August. The first will take place Saturday, Aug. 17, at 2 pm, at the Glenview Public Library (pre-registration required), 1930 Glenview Rd., Glenview. The second will take place Sunday, Aug. 25, at 6 pm, at the Glenview Park Center, 2400 Chestnut, Glenview.

"Square dancing is one of the best-kept secrets when it comes to meeting new people, using your head, and enjoying some exercise," says Glenview Squares club member Myrnice Ravitch, who met her significant other during square dance classes.

Glenview Squares hosts free "Intro" parties twice a year to spread the word about the activity. "Square dancing is a re-emerging pastime. Dancers get hooked on the mental challenge and the way it brings people together to laugh and to learn," says Janice Cha, co-president of Glenview Squares. "Some people have compared square dancing to football, where the team runs the plays and the quarterback calls the shots. But for me, the easiest way to describe it is this: teamwork set to music."

Square dancing is also a good activity for those who tend to avoid formal exercise but still want to log steps on their step counters. "A good caller using fast-paced music can help you rack up 4,000 to 5,000 steps in an evening," Cha says.

Learning the many moves does require attention--and lessons. "At the Intro to Square Dance parties, attendees will learn about 20 calls. Once they've mastered the remaining calls at lessons (starting in September), they should be ready to take part in local square dances."

Chicago North Shore clubs offering beginning square dance lessons in September include Glenview Squares; North Shore Squares, in Evanston & Wilmette; ChiTown Squares, on Chicago's North Side; and Arlington Squares in Prospect Heights.

Both single people and couples are welcome to attend the square dance parties and lessons. "Club members look forward to helping new friends learn the basics," Cha says.

As for what to wear, "the dress code for today's square dancing is casual," Cha adds. "The most important things are comfortable shoes and a smile."

Beginning Square Dance lessons, hosted with the support of Glenview Squares members, are part of the Glenview Park Center's Adult Dance program. Weekly lessons begin on Tuesday, Sept. 3, at 7:30 pm. 

Evanston Becomes First Illinois City to Earn Community Wildlife Habitat Certification

The City of Evanston continued its long history of environmental stewardship by becoming the first Illinois city to achieve certification as a Community Wildlife Habitat by the National Wildlife Federation (NWF)

Natural Habitat Evanston, a program of Citizens' Greener Evanston, led the citywide effort to earn the certification, helping to achieve one of the goals set by the City's Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP).

The NWF's Community Wildlife Habitat program partners with cities, towns, counties, neighborhoods and communities to become healthier, greener and more wildlife-friendly. Community Wildlife Habitats garden and landscape with wildlife in mind, promote the use of native trees and plants, work to reduce or eliminate the use of pesticides and chemicals, and integrate wildlife-friendly practices into sustainability plans and park master plans.
