
WHY: West Ridge Fun Fest is one of the Chamber's many community events meant to provide community goodwill and establish union between local businesses and residents.

TRADITIONAL GREEK RECIPE

ROAST LEG OF LAMB

Leg of Lamb has to be my very favorite of the red meats. It is served in different ways for different occasions. For a general small family or friends gathering, purchase a leg of lamb weighing about 5 to 6 pounds. When I serve it for Easter (Pascha) dinner or larger family gatherings of 12 or more, I purchase a leg of of lamb. In a bowl or mixing cup mix the juice from 1 lemon, the wine and the olive oil and pour over the lamb (making sure the lamb is completely covered.

Cover with foil wrap and place in the refrigerator to marinate the lamb for several hours. Roast lamb at



lamb weighing about 10 pounds. From my experience, I always make sure that I purchase USA lamb from Colorado as opposed to imported lamb. I like the taste much better. *Serves Six:*

Leg of Lamb 5 to 6 pounds
Salt and pepper
5 garlic cloves, slivered.
1 or 2 tablespoons of Oregano
1 teaspoon of thyme
juice of 1 lemon
1/2 cup of olive oil
White Wine
1/2 cup melted unsalted butter
Potatoes - I use about 7 or 8 Yukon Gold Potatoes

Wash and pat dry the leg of lamb and place in a roasting pan. Sliver the garlic. There are two methods of using the garlic with the lamb. You can rub crushed garlic onto the entire leg of lamb or make small slits with a knife and insert the slivered pieces of garlic into the lamb. I usually insert the slivered pieces of garlic in the leg of lamb. Mix the oregano and thyme and rub over all sides of thleg

350 degrees for about 1-1/2 hours if you like pink meat and about 2 hours if you prefer well done. Most Greeks prefer the well done meat.

> While roasting baste frequently with a mixture of 1/2cup

white wine and the melted butter and pour some hot water(about 1 cup) into the pan. An hour before the roast is done peal and cut each potato into four lengthwise pieces and surround the lamb with the potatoes. Sprinkle the potatoes with pepper, oregano and a little salt as well as lemon juice. Continue to baste after the potatoes have been put in the roasting pan and turn the potatoes to make sure they brown on all sides. Complete your meal with zucchini or green beans sauteed with onions in tomato sauce, a Greek salad of tomatoes, onions, cucumbers, feta cheese and Ka-

lamata olives and sprinkle with oregano and a dressing of extra virgin olive oil and red wine vinegar. Of course, if it is available to you, leg of lamb is absolutely delicious when roasted on a spit over charcoal. You may also ask your butcher to have the leg of lamb boned and rolled, it is easier to slice and handle after roasting in the oven. *KALI OREXI! (Bon Appetit) Enjoy!*

A brand new musical, "War Paint," is having its world premiere at the Goodman Theatre before its major move to New York.

What a show! What a cast! I loved it and most critics and the audience also like it. It gets a standing ovation.

Is a Health Savings Account (HSA) Right for You?



The American health care system has gone through some significant changes in recent years.

One thing that did not change, however, is the potential to save both money and taxes by opening

a Health Savings Account, or HSA. For those who qualify, an HSA allows you to save money

tax-free that can be used for health care related expenses.

Who Qualifies for a Health Savings Account?

To qualify for an HSA you must meet all of the following criteria:

• You must be covered by a "high-deductible health plan"

• You must not be covered by another health plan

• You must not be eligible to be claimed as a dependent on another person's tax return

• You must not be entitled to Medicare benefits What Is a High-Deductible Health Plan?

To be eligible for a HSA you must be covered by a health insurance plan that qualifies as a "high-deductible health plan," or HDHP. As of 2016, an individual coverage HDHP must have an annual deductible of at least \$1,300 and require that annual out-of- pocket expenses paid (including co-payments and deductibles but not insurance premiums) not exceed \$6,550. If you have a family coverage plan, the limits are an annual deductible of not less than \$2,600 and the plan must require that out-of- pocket expenses not exceed \$13,100.

Getting Started with an HSA

Opening an HSA is relatively easy. You do not need to go through your current health insurance provider nor employer to open an HSA. An HSA is independently owned by you. It can be set up with any qualified trustee or custodian, such as your bank. Opening an HSA is much the same as opening an individual retirement account (IRA). There are, however, rules about how much you can contribute to your HSA each year. As an individual, your contributions are limited to \$3,350 per year. A family account allows for contributions up to \$6,750 per year. If you are age 55 or older, however, you may contribute an additional \$1,000 per year, increasing the maximum contributions to \$4,350 for an individual and \$7,750 for a family account. If your employer sets up your HSA, both you and your employer may make contributions. Keep in mind that the contribution limits are subject to change from year to year to adjust for inflation.

Spending Your HSA Funds

The purpose of an HSA is to pay for health care-related expenses that are not covered by an existing policy. You may spend your HSA funds on any "qualified medical expense" which includes medical care, prescription drugs, and payment for long-term care. Examples of expenses that would likely be covered include:

• Doctor visits • Prescriptions • X-rays • Ambulance costs

• Vision care • Lab fees • Certain premiums for health care insurance

How Does an HSA Save Money on Taxes?

An HSA can be likened to a traditional IRA or a Roth IRA in that they all allow you to save money for a rainy day. With a traditional IRA, however, you receive a tax deduction when you make contributions to the fund but you are then taxed when you withdraw the funds. A Roth IRA does not provide a tax deduction when you make contributions, but is also not taxed when you make withdrawals. An HSA provides you with the best of both worlds. Contributions to your HSA are tax-deductible while qualified distributions are not taxable. In essence, you are able to grow the funds held in your HSA tax-free. By way of illustration, imagine you are in a 30% tax bracket. If so, a \$1,000 contribution would really cost you \$700 after taxes. If you invested that same \$1,000 in an HSA earning 7.2% interest for 10 years, your investment would grow to \$2,000. If that \$2,000 is then used to pay for qualified medical expenses, you would effectively avoid paying any taxes on the \$1,000 earned on your investment.

What Happens If You Never Need the Funds Held in Your HSA?

You could be fortunate enough to never need any of the funds held in your HSA. If that occurs, you can withdraw the funds; however, distributions made for anything other than a qualified medical expense will be taxed and will incur a 20% penalty. After age 65, you can make withdrawals without incurring a penalty, though the funds will be taxed as ordinary income.

For those who qualify, an HSA is an excellent savings and tax avoidance vehicle that provides the benefits of both a traditional IRA and a Roth IRA all-in- one. Consult with an experienced estate planning attorney in your area for additional information and to help you determine if an

HSA fits into your overall estate planning goals and objectives.

Shore Galleries Receives a Court Ordered Building Permit for a Recreational Shooting Range

On August 3, pursuant to, and in accordance with a court order, the Village of Lincolnwood issued Shore Galleries' requested building permit for the construction of a 10-lane shooting range on the second floor of its Devon Avenue facility. Previously, in 2012 the Village denied a building permit for the same facility because the Village's Zoning Administrator and Zoning Board believed that a shooting range did not fall into any permissible use category in the Zoning Code in effect in 2012. Shore sued the Village and the Cook County Circuit Court ruled in the Village's favor, indicating that it believed a shooting range was not permissible under the Codes at the time. Shore appealed the verdict and in 2014, the Illinois Appellate Court overturned the ruling and ruled in favor of Shore, indicating that this use

was permissible under the 2012 Codes. The Village has now amended its Code to make clear that shooting ranges are not allowed as permitted uses in the Village. However the court order precludes that amendment from being made applicable to Shore's plan at its Devon location.

Following several plan reviews by the Village, Shore has now complied with all applicable Building Codesand all Zoning Code provisions in effect in 2012, which are the only regulations by which the Court has provided the Village authority to rule. It is anticipated that construction will take approximately four.






