Mayor Emanuel Announces Launch Of Smart911 During National Preparedness Month, Residents Encouraged To Sign Up For The Free, Secure Service That Provides Vital Information To Emergency Responders

Mayor Rahm Emanuel announced today the launch of Smart911 as part of the city's effort to strengthen the accurate, timely and effective dispatch of emergency resources in crisis situations. Smart911 is a free, voluntary and secure service that allows individuals, families and facilities to provide personal, medical, or situational information when they call 9-1-1 to help first responders better assist in an emergency. Today, Smart911 is now available to all residents and visitors of Chicago, making the city the nation's largest single user of Smart911.

"Most people are unaware that their mobile phone cannot always determine their exact location," said Office of Emergency Management and Communications Executive Director Alicia Tate-Nadeau. "A weak cell signal or a dropped call only

Contact Lens Safety And Proper Usage

Decorative contact lenses may seem like a great way to get the spookiest costume for Halloween, but BEWARE! Even non-corrective lenses carry the same health and safety risks as other contact lenses. Most people incorrectly think that they do not require a valid prescription from a licensed eyecare professional. According to the Fairness to Contact Lens Consumers Act, which began in 2004, contact lens sellers are required to verify the validity of contact lens prescriptions before releasing contact lenses to consumers. Contact lenses need to be properly fitted in order to be worn safely, and come with varying sizes, instructions for wearing time and replacement schedule. Improperly worn contact lenses can cause a range of problems including mild irritation and redness to more serious (and painful!) issues like corneal ulcers and abrasions. At the first sign of irritation or redness, make sure to call us or stop in for an appointment. We recommend that all contact lens wearers have an eye exam and contact lens fitting annually, even if you only wear them for special occasions.

Chicago Bar Association Releases Judicial Evaluation Findings For General Election CBA 'Judge Smart Guide' Available Online

The Chicago Bar Association has released its evaluations for judicial candidates who are seeking election or retention to the Illinois Supreme Court, the Illinois Appellate Court or the Circuit Court of Cook County in the upcoming November 6 2018 general election.

The non-partisan evaluations are a comprehensive, peer-to-peer review process conducted as a long-standing public service by the CBA's Judicial Evaluation Committee. The CBA's Judicial Evaluation 'Judge Smart Guide' offers a narrative on each candidate's evaluation findings and can be found on the CBA's website using this link: www.chicagobar.org/chicagobar/votejudges.

"A Judge possesses the power to significantly impact a person's life and it is crucial that citizens arm themselves with the information that they need to make informed choices about judicial candidates who are seeking both retention and election," said Gerald Salterelli, Chairman of the CBA's Judicial Evaluation Committee.

"The Chicago Bar Association's Judicial Evaluation process and our 'Judge Smart Guide' provide a tremendous tool for the electorate to help them cast educated and smart votes for judges."

In the approaching Nov. 6 election, there are a total of 61 judges running for retention including one candidate for Illinois Appellate Court, one candidate for Illinois Supreme Court and 58 candidates Judge who was found Not Recommended following the evaluation process.

In addition, there are 44 candidates seeking election to the position of Circuit Court Judge. Of those 44, the JEC rated 13 candidates as "Highly Qualified," 25 as "Qualified" and six as "Not Recommended." Of the six candidates found "Not Recommended" two declined to participate in the JEC screening process and were found automatically "Not Recommended" pursuant to JEC governing bylaws.

Candidates who wish to be evaluated by the CBA must submit a questionnaire and participate in a screening process that evaluates on the basis of seven criteria: integrity, legal knowledge, legal ability, professional experience, judicial temperament, diligence and punctuality.

Candidates must also participate in a personal interview before members of the evaluation committee. They must receive a 60 percent favorable vote of the hearing panel members to receive a "Qualified" finding and an 80 percent favorable vote to receive a "Highly Qualified" finding.

Candidates who receive less than a 60 percent favorable vote receive a "Not Recommended" finding, as do candidates who decline to participate in the evaluation process.

The CBA's comprehensive 'Judge Smart Guide' to Judicial Elections is available on the website for visitors to review and download. A link to a condensed Judge Smart Pocket Guide is also available for easy printing and use in the voting booth. adds to the difficulty 9-1-1 dispatchers sometimes have trying to locate you. In addition, getting specific information on the location within a building, such as the apartment or floor number, is also important and can save time in a response effort. Information provided in your Safety Profile can potentially alleviate some of these difficulties, making sure you receive help fast." Preparedness and being informed is key in any emergency. NotifyChicago is the city's tool to provide residents with text messages, and/or e-mail alerts for various emergency and non-emergency situations in Chicago, including weatherrelated incidents. Helping Veterans And Active Duty Military Members

On Veterans Day, the nation honors the men and women who risk their lives to protect our freedom. Social Security honors veterans and active duty members of the military every day by giving them the respect they deserve. A vital part of that is administering the Social Security disability program.

For those who return home with injuries, Social Security is a resource they can turn to. If you know any wounded veterans, please let them know about Social Security's Wounded Warriors website. You can find it at www.socialsecurity.gov/woundedwarriors.

The Wounded Warriors website answers many commonly asked questions, and shares other useful information about disability benefits, including how veterans can receive expedited processing of disability claims. Benefits available through Social Security are different than those from the Department of Veterans Affairs and require a separate application. The expedited process is used for military service members who become disabled while on active military service on or after October 1, 2001, regardless of where the disability occurs.

Even active duty military who continue to receive pay while in a hospital or on medical leave should consider applying for disability benefits if they're unable to work due to a disabling condition. Active duty status and receipt of military pay doesn't necessarily prevent payment of Social Security disability benefits. Although a person can't receive Social Security disability benefits while engaging in substantial work for pay or profit, receipt of military payments should never stop someone from applying for disability benefits from Social Security.

Remembering the Meaning of Veteran's Day

Red, white, and blue circulars announcing 50% off all mattresses. No school! The gas station's flag flying at half mast. For too many of us, these are our Veteran's Day associations. For those of us not directly impacted by the war in Iraq, for those without friends and family who have served, it is far too easy to forget the meaning of this important day.

Veteran's Day began as Armistice Day to commemorate the end of World War I – optimistically coined "the war to end all wars." President Woodrow Wilson declared, "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice..."

Though the War did not officially end until June 28, 1919, an informal armistice was signed at the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month of the preceding year. For this reason, Veteran's Day falls on November 11. This was not always the case. Attempts were made to change the date so it would fall on Monday, making for convenient three-day weekends. Recognizing that this was not a holiday about a get-away to the Dells or shopping sprees at the mattress store, and realizing the significance of this important historic commemoration, President Gerald Ford responded to the American people and returned the holiday to November 11.

Most of us do not like war. But, we must separate those feelings from the gratitude we owe to those who have served. It is important that we take pause from our busy lives and imagine a day in the life of those in service – sleepless nights, grueling work, physical hardship, separation from loved ones, fear, and loss. It is important that we take a moment to thank the men and women who have made supreme sacrifices for our country. Come Wednesday, November 11, bake cookies for your local VFW; ask a veteran to share his or her remembrances of service; send a care package to our troops; gaze at the gas station's flag at half mast and remember exactly what that means.

C.A.R.E. boy Patch is a mostly white pointer mix with a big brown spot around his right eye and ear. This two-year-old, friendly, trusting boy is great with people and other dogs. He lived with a couple since his puppy days, but when they split up,

Patch landed back to C.A.R.E. The sudden change has left Patch feeling unsure about life. His ideal family will be willing to work with Patch to help him rebuild his confidence levels. Patch is a big boy at 50 lbs., is good with other dogs and has lived with a cat. He's housebroken, neutered, microchipped and and healthy.

Another cool canine friend is Goose the Shih Tzu mix. Goose, age 9, got his name thanks to

his unique bark, which sounds just like a honking goose. He may be an older fellow, but you'd never guess that by his joy for life, energy and love of going out for walks. Goose's foster mom calls him a 'sweet old man with



a young soul.' We recently discovered that Goose is deaf, which means he'll be learning hand signals for obedience training. Goose is a small guy, weighing only 12 lbs. He's good with other dogs, and is housebroken, neutered, microchipped and and healthy. Goose will need to be groomed about every six weeks at a cost of about \$50 per visit.

Roadside History of Illinois

This is the twenty-second in a series of monthly short articles about places in Chicago, nearby suburbs and elsewhere in the state that can be visited by those who seek to learn more about local history. The articles are partial excerpts from the book, Roadside History of Illinois (Mountain Press, 2013), by Chicago author and Illinois native Stan Banash.



Century of Progress International Exposition

Despite the Great Depression, Chicago was determined to celebrate the 100th anniversary of its 1833 founding with a world's fair. The Century of Progress International Exposition of Chicago would tout the city's advances in agriculture, construction, manufacturing, and transportation. The planning corporation for the fair got to work on January 5, 1928, in expectation of millions of visitors.

Plans for the Century of Progress built on some of the successes from the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition. The organizers brought in nationally recognized architects to design the exposition space, which featured multicolored buildings and neon lights. Promoters billed it as the "Rainbow City," analogous to the World's Columbian Exposition's "White City."

The centerpiece of the 424-acre, lakefront fair site was Northerly Island, created in the 1920s using sand dredged from Lake Michigan's shores. Attractions on the island included the Terrazzo Esplanade, the Hall of States, the Enchanted Island for Children, the Hollywood Pavilion, a number of science buildings, and many others. Temporary constructions housed pavilions for the 14 foreign nations that officially participated and 13 other countries represented by vendors or displays. One of the new buildings constructed on Northerly Island as a permanent structure was the Adler Planetarium built in 1930.

The most prominent and most popular fair attraction was the Sky Ride, which transported visitors between Northerly Island and the mainland aboard a high tramway that ran along steel cables between two 628-foot towers. Observation decks atop the towers provided a spectacular view of the fairgrounds and the surrounding country, including parts of Indiana, Michigan and Wisconsin. Another noteworthy exhibit was a full-scale replica of Fort Dearborn, which featured a number of buildings and a seventy-foot high flagpole.

The fair opened on May 27, 1933, and was scheduled to close five months later. The event was so successful, however, that the trustees chose to repeat it in 1934. With the income from the second year, the city was able to recoup its original investment and repay all its loans. Total attendance over the two years exceeded 48 million people.

The success of the fair in the midst of the Great Depression brought the hope of a prosperous future to the people of Chicago and the entire nation.

Adler Planetarium's Kavli Lecture Engages Viewers Across the Globe with Fulldome Glimpse into the Mysteries of the Universe

A human lifetime is more than a hundred million times shorter than the current age of the Universe. Whether you're a professional astronomer, or a casual backyard stargazer, you have only a few decades to take it all in—to wonder how it works and how you got here. Dr. Shane Larson is a research associate professor of physics at Northwestern University, where he is the associate director of CIERA (Center for Interdisciplinary Exploration and Research in Astrophysics). He works in the field of gravitational wave astrophysics, specializing in studies of compact stars, binaries, and the galaxy.

Linseneintopf

(German Lentil and Sausage Stew)

The literal translation is "lentil pot" (linsen + eintopf), but the recipe results are magic. Chockfull of sausage, bacon and veggies, this hearty stew is a welcome winter meal. This German dish can cook largely unattended, with just an occasional stir once it gets going, and makes a substantial meal served with warm, crusty bread.



2 med leeks, white and pale green parts only,

Ingredients

- 8 oz (227 g) lentils 6 oz (170 g) smoked bacon 1 T (17 g) tomato paste 2-1/2 C (592 g) low sodium beef broth 2 med carrots, peeled and diced
- 1 med onion, diced

Directions

Clean and rinse lentils and place in a medium saucepan with bacon, tomato paste and broth. Add water to generously cover lentils; bring to a boil over high heat. Reduce heat; simmer about 30 minutes or until lentils are tender but still intact. Add carrots, onion, leeks and potato; simmer 20 minutes more. Remove bacon, dice and return to soup. Add parsley, sausage, vinegar, salt and pepper and serve hot.
